### President's Comments

We are nearing the end of our fifth year as a group and the park will soon celebrate its 99th year of existence. The group HAS NO seed of small growing plants and NEITHER has the Belair Park seed store. IF OUR CENTENARY EFFORT IS TO BE A SUCCESS THEN WE MUST ALL TRY - NOW.

The meeting next March will be the Annual General Meeting. Before this, in February, nominations must be in for a new President, Secretary and Committee. I will not be standing for any position and other members of the present executive are not likely to stand either. So the time is at hand for members to discuss and select prospective executive members. Do not leave it to the last minute, the February meeting, but do some thinking and talking about it now.

Over Winter we had two planting days and so far other than rabbits and an odd vehicle being driven over part of the area planted, most of the seedlings are surviving. We have had one more day of Olive removal which resulted in a fine pile of these plants along with some African Boneseed. Members who have been involved in various areas removing African Boneseed etc. have done well over winter, with their respective areas looking like the original bushland.

Other problems with plantings by the VIP's etc have not been resolved at the time of writing this report, and time is running out too.
